#### **E-Learning Final Plan for SY 19-20:**

Based on the recent approval from the Ministry of Education, we will continue with <u>e-learning for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year</u>. The Ministry of Education will recognize and authenticate the end of the year report cards and transcripts.

Parents/students have three options available:

Review period in September for 4 weeks to ensure all students are prepared to be successful moving forward

\* Grades will be reflective of student's participation, work submitted during e-learning and their yearlong performance. Report card distribution will be determined later based on the COVID-19 circumstances at the time. In the interim, the report card will be attached as PDFs to each child's PowerSchool profile.

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**Option 1:** Students who have been actively involved in e-learning should continue to follow the e-learning program and complete all given assignments at their school level. Those students will be recognized for their effort and hard work during the campus closure, promoted to the next grade level when the SY 20-21 commences, and receive their report card in May.

Options available for students who have NOT been participating in e-learning:

- **Option 2:** For those students **who participated from March 2, 2020 and stopped** or **for students who have not participated**, an opportunity to submit missing work will be offered from now until **Tuesday, 14 April 2020**. Students who make up all **missing work will** be eligible to receive their report card in May and be promoted to the next grade level in SY 20-21.
- Option 3: For the non-participating students who choose to NOT complete e-learning, students must attend a mandatory Intensive Program to focus on the core subjects (for approximately three weeks) in August to make up the work that was missed. Those students will sit for exams in order to see if they will be promoted to the next grade level. These students will still have access to all the online material. The schedule and timings for the Intensive Program will be determined later once we have a better idea of how many students will need to complete this. If students choose this option and do not attend, they will not receive a final report card and will not progress to the next grade level for SY 20-21. Furthermore, in August students likely will not have the same teacher that they currently have.
